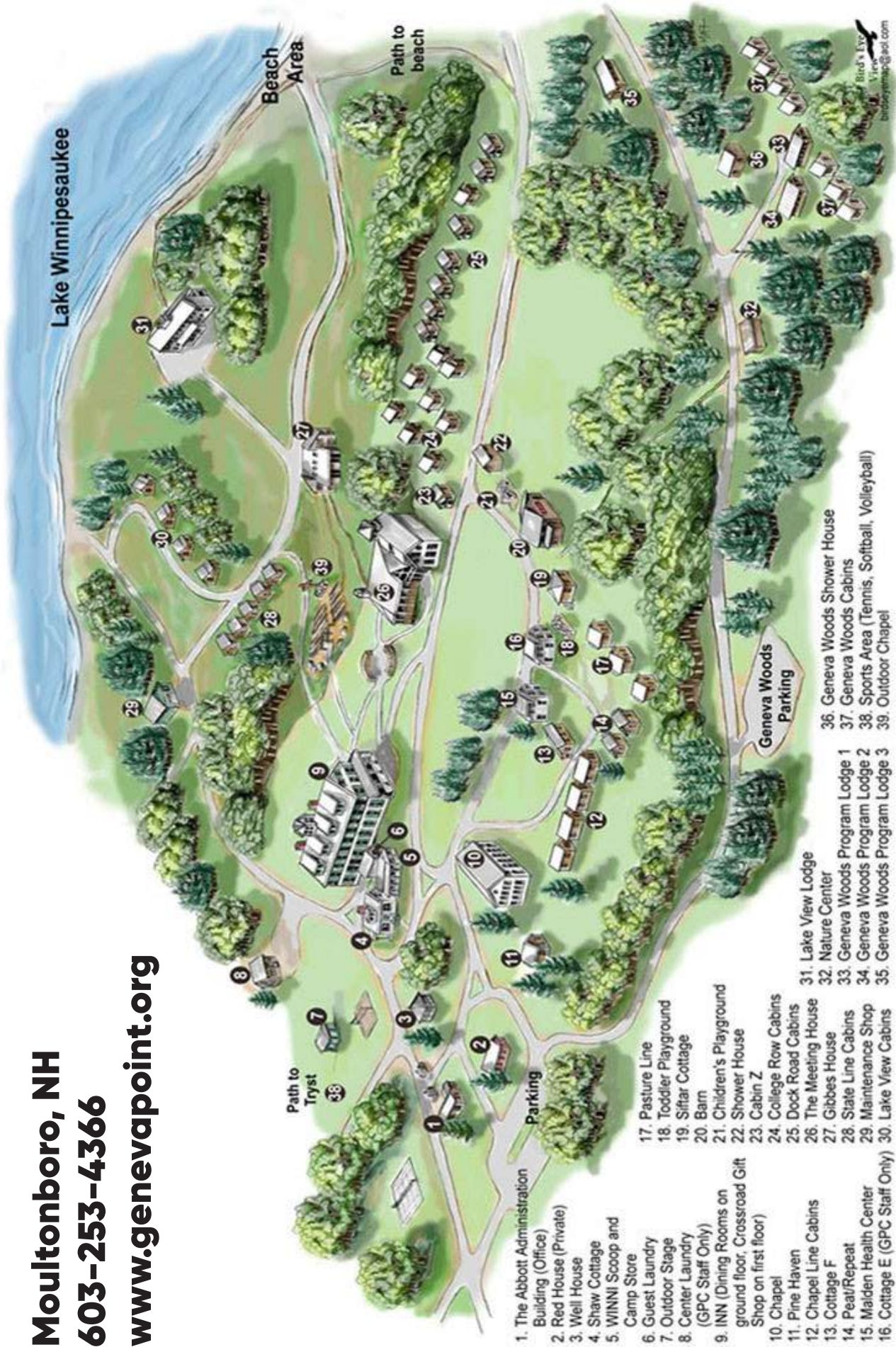

- Waterfront hours (Wednesday, Thursday and Friday) 10 AM – 12 PM, 1 PM – 5 PM, unless otherwise noted.
- During the infusion class rotation, siblings without a bleeding disorder and affected children who do not infuse, will participate in a separate activity with their counselors.
- Age ranges provided above are estimates. Some adjustments have been made to ensure groups are balanced and that there is a manageable counselor to camper ratio.
- Activities have been designed for a wide variety of ages. Archery will have a modified activity for younger children.
- **Parents are asked NOT to attend their child's infusion class during color group rotations.** This time is intended for kids to work directly with our medical team of experienced providers, as well as our Counselors – many of whom learned to infuse at Camp.

GROUND RULES FOR CAMP

- All participants must remain in supervised areas and participate in supervised and approved activities **at all times**.
- Parents or guardians may not, at any time, leave the premises without their children unless a spouse, parent, or other legal guardian remains behind to take responsibility for their children.
- **A lifeguard must be present for all waterfront activities.**
- Children under 18 must be accompanied by their parent or guardian for all waterfront activities that happen outside of their color rotations.
- **Lifejackets must be worn at all waterfront activities** except swimming. Lifejackets will be provided for boating activities.
- **Fishing is only permitted at Second Beach and Third Beach.** You may not fish at the waterfront, where people swim. If you wish to go fishing, please contact the Program Director to make arrangements on a time and location with Geneva Point Center.
 - **Anyone over the age of 16 who wishes to fish will need a license from NH.** Licenses may be obtained online; ask a NEHA staff member to print it for you.
- **Campfires may not be started without permission from Geneva Point.** If you wish to have a campfire, please contact the Program Director.
- Do not bring real or toy weapons such as knives, guns, etc.
- **If you bring a bike, you must wear a helmet.** It is also recommended that you wear elbow and knee pads due to the rough terrain. **Bike riding is not permitted after dark.**
- Scooters, skateboards, and roller blades are not allowed at Camp.
- **Pets are not allowed at Camp**, unless they are service animals. **Please don't approach or try to pet any service animal unless the owner gives you permission.**
- The electrical systems inside cabins are not equipped to support many electrics that generate heat. Please do not use appliances such as blow dryers, curling irons, hair straighteners, toasters, mini refrigerators, coffee makers, microwave ovens, air conditioners, etc. at Camp.
- Anyone under the age of 16 should not be in a golf cart unless it is an emergency or they have made arrangements ahead of time with NEHA staff.
- Quiet and courtesy time begins at 10 PM each evening.

NEHA Family Camp is a drug, marijuana and alcohol free environment. Alcoholic beverages, marijuana, and other illegal drugs are not allowed. Smoking tobacco is not permitted on campgrounds with campers present and is only permissible in places designated by Geneva Point Center. Disregard for this policy may constitute grounds for dismissal.

BIG STICK AWARD

At Family Camp, earning a “Big Stick Award” is a proud tradition. This award celebrates when a camper with a bleeding disorder who needs IV treatment—either for prophylaxis or to treat a bleed—successfully finds a vein, administers saline, and gets a blood return for the first time at camp. **It’s a major step toward independence and confidence with self-infusion.**

NEW! EMERGENCY SKILLS MEDALLION

This activity teaches kids basic information that can be used in an emergency situation as it relates to a bleeding disorder or another circumstance. Information will be taught in an age-appropriate manner and by volunteers with expertise in this topic, including Tyler Blanchard, Lissa Blanchard, and Bonnie Boomsma. Upon completion of this session, campers will receive our inaugural emergency skills medallion to wear as a display of their knowledge and skills.

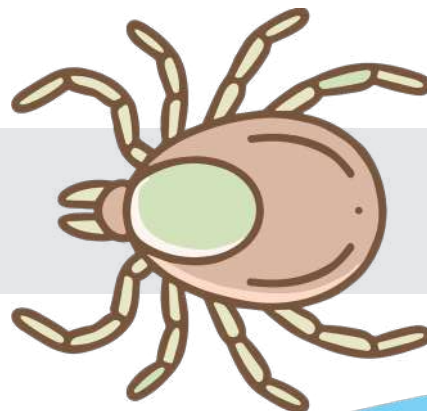
WATCH OUT FOR TICKS!
